BARAMULLA: Ahead of the counting day for General Elections to Assembly Elections 2024 on October 8, District Election Officer (DEO) Baramulla, Minga Sherpa today conducted a thorough inspection of the designated counting center at the indoor sports stadium in Baramulla.

During the visit, the DEO reviewed the arrangements and facilities at counting centers for all seven Assembly constituencies, viz. 07-Sopore, 08-Rafiabad, 09-Uri, 10-Baramulla, 11-Gulmarg, 12-Wagoora Kreeri and 13-Pattan.

The inspection was carried out to ensure that all facilities at the counting center are meticulously planned and put in place, guaranteeing a smooth and transparent counting process.

Meanwhile, the DEO inspected the physical infrastructure and security infrastructure, including the barricading for a hassle-free counting process, the provision of IT and communication systems, and proper spacing arrange-



ments for contesting candidates and their agents.

NCORD implements robust strategy to tackle rising drug abuse among students in Srinagar

SRINAGAR: The District Level Committee for NCORD has devised a comprehensive strategy to address the rising complaints and evidence of drug and substance abuse, particularly among students residing in hostels and paying guest accommodations (PGs)

In a recent NCORD meeting, chaired by Deputy Commissioner Srinagar, the district's action plan and progress in combating substance abuse and dismantling the illegal narcotics trade were discussed. The minutes of the meeting reveal a significant focus on the issue, particularly regarding students. During the meeting, the Drug De-addiction Centre at SMHS Hospital shared alarming statistics. From April

to August 2024, there were 708 new outpatient department (OPD) registrations, with a cumulative total of 6,818 registered patients.

The centre also recorded 120 in-patient admissions (IPD) for treatment and a staggering 29,357 follow-up consultations over a five-month period. Similarly, the Addiction Treatment Facility (ATF) at SKIMS, Bemina, reported 158 new patients seeking help, with 14,781 cumulative follow-up sessions during the same timeframe.

Law enforcement agencies in Srinagar shared that between April and August 2024, 20 cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act were registered, resulting in 35 arrests. Additionally, 11 individuals

were detained under the Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PIT NDPS) Act. Regarding seizures, 139.65 kg

of heroin, 15.105 kg of poppy straw, bhang, 2.69 kg of Charas, 17.8 grams of brown sugar, 36 bottles of psychoactive syrups and capsules, and 3.5 kg of ganja were confiscated in the district during the same period. The committee also reviewed

efforts to eradicate wild cannabis and poppy cultivation. Over 82 Kanals of wild cannabis were reported to have been destroyed. During the meeting on the awareness front, it was informed that 15 drug de-addiction seminars were conducted this year.

The Deputy Drug Controller of Srinagar reported that 100

percent of retail and wholesale outlets had installed CCTV cameras, and 96 percent of retail outlets had adopted computerized billing systems. The Assistant Labour Commissioner, Srinagar, informed that 52 courier service providers were registered and awareness programs were conducted in various educational institutions. Recognising the vulnerability of students, particularly those in hostels and PGs, the Deputy Commissioner outlined a series of protective measures. These include mandatory registration of all hostels and PG accommodations with local police stations, installation of CCTV cameras, maintaining student attendance registers, and discouraging outside movement of students after evening hours.

Climate change leads to decline in apple production for second year in Kashmir

SRINAGAR: Apple production in Kashmir has plummeted by at least 30% for the secweather patterns.

Growers across the region said that a series of adverse weather conditions during the critical fruit set season led to a huge drop in their yields.

Farmers said that March was characterised by dry, high temperatures, followed by a wet, cool April and a prolonged dry spell that adversely affected fruit production.

These erratic conditions disrupted essential spray schedules and led to outbreaks of scab and other diseases which further diminished an already low harvest, they said, adding that recent hailstorms and the prevalence of leaf miners have severely impacted both the quantity and quality of apple

Irshad Ahmad, a grower from

some areas, production has dropped to just 70% of last from around 1,200 apple boxes last year to barely 300 this year," he said.

He explained that many marginal farmers are struggling to cover the costs of pesticides and fertilizers, particularly since more expensive treatments were necessary to combat diseases.

After years of challenges, including untimely snowfall and hailstorms, growers had hoped for better returns this year, but those hopes have been dashed.

Recent hailstorms in south Kashmir have caused huge damage to apple crops, compelling growers to call for immediate government action, including the implementation of a crop insurance scheme to mitigate their losses.

"I went 30% this year due to erratic spring weather and recent hailstorms.

> "The apple industry has been several challenges,' Bashir said, adding that there is a dire need for a crop insurance scheme to protect growers from future losses. While last year's production was also low, higher prices provided some relief, a situation that has not repeated this year due to decreased demand.

Kashmir typically produces over 20 lakh metric tonnes of apples annually, occasionally reaching up to 25 lakh metric tonnes. The 2017 economic survey of J&K indicated that half of Kashmir's population relies directly or indirectly on the apple industry, with over 3.5 lakh hectares dedicated to apple cultivation.
