'Centuries-old' stone sculpture of Hindu deity unearthed in Gulmarg

SRINAGAR: A stone sculpture of a Hindu deity, presumed to be centuries old, has been unearthed in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district, police said on

The sculpture, believed to depict either Lord Vishnu or Lord Surya, was discovered on the outskirts of Gulmarg during a routine patrol conducted by the Gulmarg police station, an official said.

The police later handed over the sculpture to the archaeology department.

The official said the artefact, crafted in fine stone, appears to be centuries old and reflects the rich cultural and historical heritage of the region.

Police took immediate steps to ensure its safety and preservation and coordinated with the Directorate of Archives, Archaeology and Museums, Jammu and Kashmir, for proper documentation and conservation, the spokesman said.

The police handed over the ancient stone sculpture to the team from the Directorate of Archives, Archaeology & Museums, headed by Javed Ahmad Mattoo.

This underscore Jammu and Kashmir Police's commitment to preserving the archaeological treasures of the region and promoting awareness about its history, the official asserted.

Criminal nabbed with sharp edged weapon

JAMMU: In a continued crackdown on criminal activities, Jammu (Rural) Police intercepted a vehicle JK02DF-2625 during patrolling on the intervening night of 03/12/2025 in the Domana area. Admissions to Vaishno Devi medical college made purely on merit through NEET: Dy CM

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Deputy Chief Minister Surender Chaudhary on Friday said that admissions to the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Medical College were made purely on merit through NEET and should not be viewed from a religious perspective.

"My point is that children's education should not be judged on the scale of religion. Look at their merit. The students who have taken admission are meritorious candidates. They qualified through an examination and were selected on the basis of merit through NEET," Chaudhary told reporters here.

Choudhary was replying to questions on sidelines of a function on the 120th birth anniversary of Sher-e-Kashmir Sheikh

Reiterating that the issue was being "unnecessarily politicised", the deputy chief minister said, "It is not about who is saying what. The students selected at the Mata Vaishno Devi Medical College were admitted on the basis of merit through NEET."

Commenting on the ongoing protests by the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Sangharsh Samiti, he said the outfit does not represent the views of all sections of Jammu. "The Sangharsh Samiti does not reflect the thinking of the people of Jammu. All their affiliations are aligned with the BJP. The truth is that the BJP has not come forward openly and has instead put the Sangharsh Samiti committee in front to lead this movement," he alleged.

He urged people to question the political backing of the agitation. "You should ask the BJP and the leaders of the Sangharsh Samiti about whom they are really aligned with," he

The agitation by the Sangharsh Samiti, a conglomeration of dozens of Hindu organisations, followed the selection of 42 Muslim, one Sikh and seven Hindu candidates for the 50 sanctioned MBBS seats for the 2025-26 academic session, all chosen through the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test

Chaudhary also targeted the BJP over its criticism of the legal framework governing admissions. "If the BJP talks about the Act (of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Medical University), it remained in power in Jammu and Kashmir for 11 years — first as part of the BJP-PDP alliance government and later during the LG administration, which the BJP itself claims association with. Why did they not remember this Act during those 11 years? Now, when the Omar Abdullah government is in place, they are raising these allegations," he said.

He said sufficient time was available to amend the Act if the BJP had intended to do so. "There was no shortage of time during those 11 years to change the Act if they really wanted to. Our government has no role in this matter. The lieutenant governor is the chancellor of the universities and the universities function under him. So against whom is the BJP agitating now — the LG?"

Demanding distribution of seats based on religion wrong: PDP

KATRA/JAMMU: Democratic Party (PDP) president Mehbooba Mufti on Friday said that ignoring merit and demanding distribution of seats based on religion was wrong and would harm the social fabric of Jammu and Kashmir and the entire country.

The political row erupted after the Shri Mata Vaishnodevi Medical College completed admissions through the NEET merit list earlier this month, with the college admitting 42 Muslim students, mostly from Kashmir. Besides, seven Hindu students from Jammu and one Sikh were selected for the inaugural MBBS batch of 50.

The Jammu and Kashmir Board of Professional Entrance Examination (JK-BOPEE) decided to admit these students to the medical college run by the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board in the Katra area of Jammu.

"It is very wrong to ignore merit and demand distribution of seats on the basis of religion. Such things should not happen. "It will not only spoil the

atmosphere of Jammu and Kashmir but will also affect the entire country. If this begins here, it will spread to other parts as well," Mehbooba told reporters here. The PDP chief, who travelled by the Vande Bharat

train from Srinagar to take part in a function at Katra, said that the demand for allotting seats on religious lines should not be entertained. She recalled that when the

Speaking during Zero Hour, Sat Sharma underscored that the Poonch-Shri Budha Amarnath Road serves as a lifeline for the region—connecting trict headquarters with the revered Budha Amarnath Shrine and providing daily access for schoolchildren, patients, and residents from numerous villages. He emphasized that the current dilapidated condition of the

road is not merely an inconvenience but a grave public safety hazard, already responsible for repeated accidents and dangerously delayed emergency responses.

Sharma informed the House that the road is riddled with deep potholes, remains waterlogged in multiple stretches, and has seen persistent neglect despite earlier allocations for repair and strengthening. He expressed concern that substandard workmanship, inadequate oversight, and delayed execution have eroded public trust and damaged the region's potential for religious tourism, which is a major contributor to the local economy.

Calling the situation "deeply distressing and unacceptable," Sat Sharma urged the Union Government to direct concerned ministries and implementing agencies to undertake immediate restoration work along with a comprehensive long-term plan to ensure an all-weather, durable road.

UDHAMPUR: In compliance with the directions of the Supreme Court of India regarding the management of stray dogs within educational, health and other public institutions, the Deputy Commissioner Udhampur, Saloni Rai on Friday convened a meeting of the District Level Committee to review the status of implementation of these directions in the district.

During the meeting, the DC instructed the concerned departments to identify and prepare a detailed line listing of all educational and health institutions, bus stand, railway station, sports complexes and other vulnerable locations for ensuring adequate safety measures.

The CEO Municipality was directed to identify pet shops and shelter homes under the jurisdiction of MC Udhampur. while ensuring 100% sterilization and The DC emphasized the need for strict

compliance with the Supreme Court directives, highlighting that the safety and welfare of children and the general public must be upheld with utmost priority.

She further directed the Chief Medical Officer to ensure adequate stock of Anti-Rabies Vaccines in all the government as well as private health institutions across the district.

The Municipalities of the District were directed to construct separate shelter sheds and quarantine facilities for dogs to ensure their proper care and manage-

The DC called upon all stakeholders to maintain close inter-departmental coordination, conduct regular inspections, promptly plug any existing gaps and ensure time-bound implementation of the Supreme Court guidelines.
