

DDC Chairman inspects condition of upcoming Road in Bhaderwah Town

Construction workers educated about Labour Codes, Welfare Schemes at Trigam Khari

The initiative aimed to generate awareness about the social security and welfare schemes tailored for construction workers. The camp witnessed overwhelming participation of workers, who evinced keen interest in learning about the newly implemented Labour Codes and the wide range of benefits offered under the Jammu & Kashmir



Building and Other Construction Workers' Welfare Board (JKBOCWBB). Assistant Labour Commissioner Amit Kumar explained the key provisions of the new Labour Codes, highlighting their importance in ensuring fair wages, safe working conditions and access to social security benefits including health-

care, education and pension support. A major focus of the event was on enrollment under JKBOCWBB, which provides financial assistance to Workers to meet medical needs, education of wards, maternity support, skill development training and housing benefits. Workers were encouraged to com-

plete their registration through the official online portal or visiting the labour office to get access to these schemes. The Bank Manager Khari also briefed participants on several government-backed social security schemes, including Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan (PMSYM), Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY), Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJBY) and Atal Pension Yojana (APY). The camp also provided on-the-spot services including JKBOCWBB registrations, labour card renewals, PMSBY and PMJJBY form submissions, benefiting dozens of workers instantly.

Financial awareness camp on Unclaimed Deposits organised

RAMBAN: The Lead District Manager (LDM) Ramban today organised a financial literacy awareness camp to inform the public about the 'Your Money, Your Right' Campaign launched by the Government to facilitate citizens to claim their unclaimed deposits, insurance amount, pending pension etc. The general public was given insights into the procedures for identifying, verifying and claiming unclaimed bank deposits. The public was made aware of the use of the RBI's UDGAM portal (udgam.rbi.org.in), through which individuals can search details of unclaimed deposits lying in the banks and take steps to claim the rightful amount. It was also highlighted that a total of Rs. 6.15 crore is currently lying as unclaimed deposits in banks across Ramban district.



A key highlight of the event was the handing over of cheques to 13 beneficiaries, amounting to Rs. 15.43 lakh, who had successfully claimed their unclaimed deposits. The Deputy Commissioner handed over the cheques to the beneficiaries, encouraging others to come forward and utilise the facility. Speaking at the event, the Deputy Commissioner appreciated the LDM and the banking fraternity for conducting the outreach initiative. He emphasised the importance of maintaining updated bank records, completing KYC

formalities, and ensuring regular account activity to prevent accounts from becoming inoperative. He urged people to utilise the UDGAM portal for easy tracking and settlement of unclaimed deposits. Earlier, the LDM briefed participants on the step-by-step process to claim unclaimed or dormant deposits and highlighted the role of banks in assisting customers. The Deputy Commissioner called upon all banks to intensify awareness camps across the district to further strengthen financial inclusion and customer service.
