Terror networks must be crushed with decisive action, people backing: Sinha



'De-freezing of teacher posts under discussion'

JAMMU: Education Minister Sakeena Itoo announced on Monday that the government is actively considering the de-freezing of teacher positions to address the shortage of educators in schools across Jammu and Kashmir.

In response to a question from MLA Pawan Kumar Gupta of the BJP during the Legislative Assembly session, the minister explained that the recruitment of teacher positions was frozen by the lieutenant governor-led State Administrative Council in 2018.

She emphasised that the government is making efforts to lift this freeze to expedite the recruitment process within the department.

Itoo noted that 594 lec-

turer positions in 27 disciplines have been referred to the J-K Public Service Commission. Additionally, 727 non-teaching posts and 43 multi-tasking staff positions have been sent to the finance department for revival or concurrence.

Regarding the filling of vacant teacher positions, she said that these posts have been frozen for the transition of Regularised Rehbar-e-Taleem (RRETs), Teacher Grade II and III, to resolve salary issues for educators engaged under the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan program.

The education minister also mentioned that in 2025-2026, a total of 258 senior lecturers have been elevated as in-charge principals, besides 56 PG Masters and ▶ P11



J-K draws Rs 14.94 cr investment post-FY23

JAMMU: Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Kumar Choudhary on Monday said Jammu and Kashmir has attracted private investments worth Rs 14,948 crore in past four years, generating employment for 64,515 people in the industrial sector.

Replying to a question by BJP MLA Sunil Bhardwaj in the Legislative Assembly, the Deputy Chief Minister also said 1,452 industrial units have been set up in Jammu and Kashmir since 2022-23.

Giving details, he said 629 industrial units were established in 2022-23 with an

investment of Rs 2,153.45 crore, generating employment for 15,719 people. In 2023-24, 234 units attracted Rs 3,389.37 crore investment and generated 29,969 jobs, while 405 units in 2024-25 brought in Rs 4,145.59 crore investment, creating 11,396 jobs.

He said that during 2025-26 till December, 184 industrial units attracted Rs 5,260 crore investment and generated employment for 7,431 persons.

Choudhary said that the government has formulated multiple policies and schemes to attract private investments in the Union Territory. ▶ P11

Rs 19 Cr cocaine haul busted in fake currency investigation

JAMMU: Questioning of an accused arrested in a counterfeit currency case led to the seizure of cocaine worth over Rs 19 crore in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district, police said on Monday.

On February 3, a written complaint was lodged at Bari Brahmana police station by a branch manager of Punjab National Bank, regarding depositing of fake currency notes.

The bank official had alleged that Dil Mohd, a resident of Digiana Ashram, had deposited fake currency notes having a face value of Rs 9,000, a police spokesman said.

He said a probe was

launched after registering an FIR under relevant sections of BNS at Bari Brahmana police station. During the investigation, police obtained bank account statements of the accused who is presently residing at Jalalabad locality of Sunjwan in Jammu.

Scrutiny of the accounts revealed balances of about Rs 18 lakh in J&K Bank and Rs 2.40 lakh in PNB, the spokesman said, adding a special investigation team was set up by the Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Samba to ascertain the source of the bank balances, given that the accused was working

as a driver by profession.

During questioning, he said the accused disclosed that he is selling cocaine since long and had earned the said amount through drug trafficking.

Police recovered two packets of cocaine, weighing approximately 1937.80 grams, in cardboards wrapped with cello tape hidden in the garage at his workplace in Bari Brahmana, the spokesman said, adding relevant sections of NDPS Act were added in the case.

More arrests and recoveries are expected at the disclosure of the arrested drug peddler, he said.

45-year-old Pak national repatriated

Unemployment in J&K higher than national average at 6.7%

JAMMU: The unemployment rate in Jammu and Kashmir has remained consistently higher than the national average over the past several years, Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary said on Monday, citing official data from the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS).

In a written reply to a question by legislator Mubarak Gul in the J&K Legislative Assembly here, he said the overall unemployment rate stands at 6.7 per cent in the Union Territory,

which is significantly higher than the national average of 3.5 per cent.

Quoting the PLFS of the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, the deputy chief minister who is minister in charge Labour and Employment department said the unemployment rate among persons aged 15 years and above in Jammu and Kashmir has remained higher than the national average over the last six years.

In 2024-25, the unemployment rate in the UT stood at 6.7 per cent against the all-India average of 3.5 per cent.




Terror accused stabbed to death in Faridabad jail

FARIDABAD: A 20-year-old terror accused, Abdul Rehman, who was lodged in Neelam Jail for his alleged involvement in a conspiracy to carry out an explosion in Ayodhya, was murdered by a fellow inmate following a brawl inside the prison premises on Monday, police said.

According to the police, the murder is allegedly the handiwork of another prisoner, Arun Chaudhary, who was recently transferred from Jammu and Kashmir.

The incident occurred around 2.00 am in Chakki No 2 of security ward 3B, located near Barrack No 3. During a heated altercation, Chaudhary allegedly ▶ P11
