### Rangers hold flag meeting along Border

**JAMMU:** The Border Security Force (BSF) and Pakistan Rangers on Thursday held a flag meeting along the International Border in the R S Pura sector here, officials said.

# India clears 114 Rafale jets in Rs 3.6 Lakh Cr Defence push

Ministry seals deal to procure 8 Dornier aircrafts



**NEW DELHI:** The defence ministry on Thursday cleared a long-pending proposal to procure 114 Rafale fighter jets under a government-to-government framework with France, nearly 13 years after a similar acquisition was almost firmed up but it could not be sealed.

In total, capital acquisition of military hardware worth Rs 3.60 lakh crore was approved by the Defence Acquisition Council (DAC),

chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, to enhance the combat readiness of defence forces, according to an official readout.

Under the project, 18 aircraft will be supplied by Dassault Aviation, the maker of Rafale, in a fly away condition and the rest will be manufactured in India with over 50 per cent indigenous that will be to be met in phases, sources said.

Though the defence min-

istry did not provide the cost of the procurement, it is expected to be in the range of Rs 2.90 lakh crore to Rs 3.15 lakh crore.

The approval for procurement of the Rafale jets came just four days ahead of French President Emmanuel Macron's visit to India.

However, a formal contract to seal the deal is unlikely before the end of the year as the defence ministry will now have to carry out negotiations with Dassault Aviation to finalise the cost and finer details of the weapons package.

The Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi will also have to give a final approval to the acquisition programme.

In April 2019, the Indian Air Force issued an RFI (Request for Information), or initial tender to acquire 114 Multi-Role Fighter ► P11

The intervention came after a sharp attack by BJP legislator R. S. Pathania, who accused the Government of failing to put in place a credible regulatory and enforcement structure to counter the



growing influence of misleading digital content.

Raising the issue during the sitting, Pathania said the lack of a clearly defined reg-

ulatory and institutional framework was leaving society exposed to organised misinformation. He argued that the problem went beyond ru-

## Pratham Pooja for Shri Amarnathji Yatra on June 29 SASB enhances accidental cover for Yatris, service providers to Rs 10L

**JAMMU:** The authorities on Thursday enhanced the accidental insurance cover for registered Shri Amarnathji Yatris, service providers and 'pujaris' from Rs 5 lakh to Rs 10 lakh, strengthening the safety net for all stakeholders associated with the annual pilgrimage in south Kashmir, officials said.

The decision was taken at the 50th board meeting of the Shri Amarnath Ji Shrine Board (SASB) chaired by J-K Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, an official spokesman said.

The Board also announced that the 'Pratham Pooja' for the 2026 pilgrimage will be performed on June 29 on the occasion of 'Jyeshtha Purnimaa'.

The formal commencement date for the Yatra will be finalised soon, the spokesman said.

Lakhs of pilgrims from



across the country annually visit the 3,880-metre high holy cave shrine of Shri Amarnath, housing the naturally formed ice Shivalinga.

The Yatra takes place from twin routes – the traditional 48 km route from Pahalgalam in Anantnag, and the 14 km shorter but steeper Baltal route in Ganderbal district.

The Board approved the setting up of a laser and sound show dedicated to 'Baba Barfani', to be hosted in

both Srinagar and Jammu, which will also serve as a cultural beacon, highlighting the rich spiritual history of the Union territory, the spokesman said.

The Board also gave its nod to various key measures and interventions to further enhance the spiritual experience and convenience of the devotees for the upcoming Yatra, the spokesman said.

The Board decided to enhance the accidental insurance cover for registered Ya-

tris, service providers, officials, seasonal workers and 'pujaris' from Rs 5 lakh to Rs 10 lakh, other than discussing and approving various welfare measures for the SASB employees, the spokesman said.

L-G Sinha, who is also chairman of the SASB, directed the concerned officials to identify spots for installing suitable toilet facilities along the Yatra routes.

## No violation in 133 vehicle purchase: Govt

**JAMMU:** The Jammu and Kashmir government on Thursday said that it has purchased 133 luxury vehicles in the financial year 2024-25 and maintained that procurement of official vehicles was strictly in accordance with prescribed norms, denying any lack of standardisation in the process.

In a written reply to a question by BJP MLA Ranbir Singh Pathania, Transport Minister Satish Sharma said the State Motor Garages Department purchased 133 luxury vehicles in 2024-25 and 10 in FY 2023-24.

## '1400 illegal structures demolished'

## Govt: Efforts on to bring J-K youth in mainstream
