Decades old dream realized; LG lays foundation for Shankaracharya Temple at SMVD Foothills

Soul of J&K deeply rooted in India's rich civilizational heritage

KATRA: Marking a historic milestone, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha laid the foundation stone Wednesday for the much-anticipated Sri Shankaracharya Temple.

Perched on hillocks beside the revered Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine, this project takes root after decades, realizing a vision first envisioned in the 1960s.

Total expenditure for the temple complex, amounting to Rs. 31.51 crore, will be fully borne by Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board.

The Lieutenant Governor announced that the Shrine Board will construct 50 commercial shops within the Temple complex, which will be allotted to the landowners who donated it for sacred cause.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between



the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board (SMVDSB) and the concerned landowners was executed in 2025, wherein the landowners have consented to donate 41 Kanals for sacred cause.

"In the years ahead, the Sri Shankaracharya Temple will serve as a spiritual anchor for millions of devotees. It will be a living emblem of India's eternal culture, collective faith, resilience, and profound

spiritual-cultural consciousness.

Devotee visiting Shri Mata Vaishno Devi for darshan will also come to Sri Shankaracharya Temple, generating significant economic

momentum across the region. This influx will create employment opportunities, strengthen local enterprises, and inject fresh energy into overall regional development," the Lieutenant Governor said.

During his visit to the holy town of Katra, the Lieutenant Governor presided over the 'Samridh Nari, Samridh Bharat' program at the Spiritual Growth Centre, where he interacted with the women entrepreneurs of Self-Help Groups of Reasi and adjoining areas.

The Lieutenant Governor reiterated the commitment of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board towards keeping spiritual hubs vibrant while prioritizing every devotee's comfort, safety, and dignity.

CM Tables 13 Demands, 19 supplementary grants

JAMMU: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah Wednesday moved 13 Demands and 19 supplementary Demands in the Legislative Assembly which was subsequently presented before the House for discussion by Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather.

"I move that a sum not exceeding the aggregate amount mentioned in Demand Nos. 1, 3, 4, 6, 8, 9, 10, 14, 19, 20, 24, 31 and 33 be granted to Government to defray the charges which

will come in course of payment during the year ending 31st March, 2027 in respect of Heads indicated in the List of Business against each demand," Chief Minister said.

These Demands for Grants pertain to General Administration Department, Planning, Monitoring and Development, Information, Power, Finance, Parliamentary Affairs, Law & Justice, Revenue, Housing, Tourism, Hospitality & Protocol, Estates, Culture and Disaster ► P11

Assembly adjourned after noisy scenes

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir Assembly on Wednesday was adjourned after witnessing noisy scenes as BJP MLAs protested the alleged police use of force against students who were demanding the establishment of a National Law University (NLU) in Jammu.

The uproar erupted when the House was discussing grants related to Chief Minister Omar Abdullah. BJP members rose from their seats and raised slogans against the police action near the Civil Secretariat and in support of the demand for NLU in Jammu.

Carrying pamphlets which read "NLU for Jammu", the BJP legislators strongly pitched for the setting up of the law university in the Jammu region.

Besides, they sought a reply from the government over police action against the protesting students.

History made; J&K enter Ranji Final for first time in 67 years

House hails historic entry; LG, CM congratulate

KALYANI: Sixty-seven years after their maiden appearance, Jammu and Kashmir stormed into the Ranji Trophy finals for the first time on Wednesday, upstaging two-time former champions Bengal by six wickets in the semifinals here to add another historic chapter to a fairytale season so far.

Aquib Nabi's stunning nine-wicket match haul and their IPL star Abdul Samad's fearless strokeplay ensured that the side once labelled "perennial underachievers" now stands one step away from the title.

Chasing a modest 126 at the Bengal Cricket Academy ground, J&K rode on Samad's unbeaten 30 off 27 balls (3x6, 1x4) and rookie Vanshaj Sharma's composed 43 not out off 83 ball (4x4) as the pair stitched an unbroken 55-run stand for the fourth wicket to seal history on the day of the semifinal.

In a heartwarming gesture, Samad, who had done the bulk of the damage, allowed the 22-year-old Vanshaj to finish it in style and the youngster launched Mukesh Kumar over long-on for the first time. ► P11

J&K crafts Cancer Control Strategy with top institutions

Doodhpathri reopens after Pahalgam attack closure, brings relief to tourism sector, visitors

BUDGAM: After remaining closed for nearly ten months following last year's deadly terror attack in Pahalgam, the picturesque meadow of Doodhpathri in central Kashmir has finally reopened, bringing much-needed relief to tourism stakeholders and renewed hope for economic recovery in the region.

The destination was shut in April 2025 after the attack in Pahalgam claimed the lives of 26 civilians, including 25 tourists. In the aftermath, the Jammu and Kashmir administration led by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha ordered the temporary closure of several prominent tourist

spots across the Union Territory as a precautionary security measure.

Following a comprehensive security review, the Lieutenant Governor recently directed the reopening of 14 tourist destinations, including Doodhpathri, signalling improved ground conditions and a renewed push to revive the tourism sector.

Local stakeholders — including pony operators, hoteliers, guides, food vendors and transporters — welcomed the move, saying the prolonged closure had severely affected their livelihoods.

"The closure after the Pahalgam attack pushed many of us to the brink. We had no work for months. The reopen-

Five detained as manhunt for juvenile home escapee widens

JAMMU: At least five suspected persons have been detained for questioning amid intensified search for a gangster who remained at large after escaping a juvenile home, along with two Pakistani inmates, in a border village of Jammu, officials said on Wednesday.

Both the Pakistani nationals were arrested on Tuesday, within 20 hours of the incident near Ambala railway station in Haryana, while they were heading for Nepal.

Karajeet Singh alias Gugga, a resident of Dablehar in R S Pura, and Pakistan citizens, Mohammad

Suna-ullah (20) and Ahsan Anwar (21), allegedly attacked police personnel and fled from the juvenile home around 5 pm on Monday (February 16). Two cops were injured in the incident.

A purported video of the gangster, said to be associated with the 'Khauff' gang, showing Singh resorting to a few rounds of firing inside the juvenile home, is circulating on social media, drawing public concern.

The officials said Singh, who is believed to be the mastermind of the escape, is still at large, and efforts are on to arrest him.

RSS Chief slams US, China approach, says World needs Bharat's solutions

LUCKNOW: Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat on Wednesday took a swipe at the US and China, alleging that they tend to "finish those who come in their way" and asserting that India has the solutions to many of the challenges confronting the world.

Addressing a Shodharthi Samvad programme at the Malaviya Auditorium of Lucknow University, the RSS chief said, "Western countries spread fundamentalism.

Their thinking is to become powerful, live on their own, and abandon the rest, eliminating those who become obstacles. This is what America and China are doing today."

He asserted that solu-

tions to global problems lie in India. "Today, India has the answers to the problems facing the world. If we want to become a world leader, we must become powerful in all areas. The world only believes it when truth is backed by power," he said.

Stressing the role of re-

search in nation-building, Bhagwat said, "Research plays a major role in changing India's direction and condition. Truthful information should be brought to light. We will not be able to understand India through ignorance."

He urged researchers to work selflessly for the country. "Whatever research you do, do it with excellence, authenticity, with body, mind, and money, and selflessly for the country. There is a lot of negative propaganda about the Sangh Parivar. Researchers should bring out the truth," he said.

J&K Saffron output drops to 19.58 MT in 2024-25

JAMMU: Saffron production in Jammu and Kashmir has declined from 23.53 metric tonnes in 2023-24 to 19.58 metric tonnes in 2024-25, according to official data.

In a written reply to a question raised by National Conference MLA Asif Naseem Masoodi, Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Kumar Choudhary said that the total area under Saffron cultivation in the Union Territory has remained constant at 1,16.27 hectares, but output and productivity have fluctuated.
