'Aggressive outreach needed to unlock tourism potential in UT'

JAMMU: Union Home Minister Amit Shah reviewed the progress of development projects in Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday, highlighting the need to utilise the full potential of hydropower projects in the Union Territory.

Chairing a high-level review meeting at the Lok Bhawan here, Shah said under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, the Centre is firmly committed to the vision of building a developed and prosperous Jammu and Kashmir.

The meeting continued for nearly two hours and was attended by Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, Chief Minister



Trust is India's strongest currency, says PM; flags EU, US trade deals
'Trade deals brace Make in India, create jobs'



KUALA LUMPUR: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday said India is seen as a "trusted partner for growth" and it was reflected in the recent trade deals it has agreed with various countries, including the UK, USA and the EU. Addressing a community programme here, Modi said

the Indian diaspora served as a living bridge between India and Malaysia and announced a new consulate in the archipelago nation and the Thiruvalluvar Scholarship to enable students to study in India. Modi, who arrived in Kuala Lumpur on Saturday on a two-day visit, referred to

the trade deals India agreed with various countries and said India is seen as a "trusted partner for growth".

"Trust has become India's strongest currency," Modi said, citing trade deals with the UK, UAE, Australia, New Zealand, Oman, the EU and the US.

Malaysia is home to nearly three million people of Indian descent, the second largest in the world, with an overwhelming majority of Tamil origin.

Greeting the Indian community members in different languages, the prime minister made it a point to highlight the singing abilities of his Malaysian counterpart Anwar Ibrahim, particularly his love of Tamil songs of legendary actor-politician M G Ramachandran (MGR).

"Tamil is India's gift to the world. Tamil literature is eternal, and Tamil culture is global. Tamil people have served humanity with their talents," Modi said, recalling that India's Vice ► P11


Porter hurt in landmine blast near LoC

JAMMU: An army porter was injured in a landmine explosion near the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday, officials said.

Zulufqar Ahmad (24), a resident of Slotri-Patiya village, was injured when he accidentally stepped on a landmine in a forward area in Mankote sector at around 2.10 pm, the officials said.

As part of an anti-infiltration obstacle system, the forward areas are dotted with landmines, which sometimes get washed away by rain, resulting in such accidents, they added.

LoP Sunil calls special status demand 'betrayal', says Art 370 stands buried

JAMMU: Leader of Opposition Sunil Sharma on Saturday rubbished the demand for restoration of "special status" to Jammu and Kashmir, asserting that Article 370 is a "historical provision that now stands buried".

Addressing mediapersons outside the assembly here, Sharma said the Constitution does not mention "special status" in connection with Jammu and Kashmir's accession or merger with India.

He criticised National Conference (NC) legislators for raising the demand, alleging that it amounted to "betrayal" and was being used

for political purposes.

"Several states demand special financial packages, but that should not be confused with Article 370," Sharma said.

Commenting on Jammu and Kashmir's budget, the

BJP leader accused the ruling party of "mocking daily wagers and unemployed youth" while focusing on the issue of special status.

Tourist footfall hits 1.77 Cr; including 36,000 foreigners

JAMMU: Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir received more than 1.77 crore tourists in 2025, including over 36,000 foreign visitors, the government informed the Legislative Assembly on Saturday.

In a written reply to a question by MLA Hasnain Masoodi, the Tourism Department, said 1,77,65,390 tourists visited the Union Territory between January 1 and December 31, 2025. Of them, 36,410 were international travellers, while 1,77,28,980 were domestic tourists.

The government said it has not set specific targets for

tourist arrivals in 2026, but stressed that sustained promotional and developmental measures are underway to boost both domestic and foreign inflow.

On the resumption of international flights from Srinagar airport, the government said the airport is fully equipped with immigration, customs, security, and passenger-handling facilities. However, the start of international operations depends on the operational and commercial decisions of airlines.

The department said the airport remains prepared to facilitate international flights as soon as airlines

choose to begin services.

Regarding the Home Stay Programme, the government said the initiative has been largely successful, enhancing accommodation capacity, generating local employment, and encouraging community participation in tourism. Given its positive impact, the programme is likely to be expanded to other potential areas. The reply also noted challenges such as limited awareness, capacity gaps, and infrastructure issues, which the department is addressing through awareness drives, capacity-building initiatives, and coordination with concerned departments.
