'Need to reposition Jammu around its heritage, history'

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday said his government is planning to develop nine new tourism destinations across the Union Territory, expressing hope that the World Bank will put aside its "traditional sort of reluctance" to fund any project in J&K.

He also asserted that Jammu's positioning in tourism sector needs to be built around its heritage, around its history, around the religious side of it and the border part of it, while saying that the government plans to push for ensuring pilgrimage sites and des-

for 8-10 hrs daily by NIA

NEW DELHI: Mumbai terror attacks key mastermind Tahawwur Hussain Rana is being interrogated for eight to ten hours daily by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) sleuths to unravel a larger conspiracy behind the dreaded strikes, official sources said on Monday.

The NIA officials are ensuring Rana's medical check-up and he is being allowed to meet his lawyer, according to the order of a Delhi court that had on early Friday morning granted 18-day custody to the probe agency following his extradition from the US, they said.

The sources said Rana is being grilled by the NIA investigators for around eight to ten hours daily to probe a larger conspiracy behind

the 2008 dastardly strikes orchestrated by Pakistan-based terrorist group Lashkar-e-Taiba and in which 166 people were killed and over 238 injured.

"Rana has been cooperating during the questioning," a source said, adding that a team of NIA officials led by Chief Investigating Officer Jaya Roy is interrogating

The sources said Rana has so far asked for only three things -- a pen, paper sheets or notepad and Quran -- which have been provided

They said there has not been any specific food-related demand raised by Rana so far and he is being provided with "food items which are given to any > P11

temple reopens

JAMMU: The revered shrine of Shree Machail Mata in Jammu and Kashmir's Kishtwar district has been reopened for pilgrims after winter, heralding the commencement of the annual Yatra season, officials said on Monday.

The temple was thrown open on the occasion of Baisakhi on Sunday with Jammu divisional commissioner Ramesh Kumar reviewing the arrangements for the annual pilgrimage, the officials said.

The event marked the shifting of the idol of Goddess Machail Mata (Durga) from the house of local priest Pehalwan Singh to the temple amid religious rituals and a grand fair.

The reopening of the temple was also attended by BJP MLA from Padder-Nagseni Sunil Sharma and Kishtwar deputy commissioner Rajesh Kumar Shavan, the officials said. > P11

Rs 1800 cr drugs seized

PM claims Cong turned SCs, STs, OBCs into 'second-class citizens'

HISAR: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday led the BJP's nationwide charge on its political rivals and the ruling party's push to be identified closely with Bhim Rao Ambedkar on the birth anniversary of the iconic figure, especially among Dalits.

Amid the political heat over the Waqf (Amendment) Act, Modi sought to put the Congress and its allies opposed to the law in a corner, accusing them of destroying the Constitution by enacting a Waqf law, now amended, in 2013 above the constitutional values espoused by Ambedkar.

The prime minister travelled to Haryana to launch several development projects as he championed his government's commitment to Ambedkar's ideals.

Modi launched a scathing attack on the Congress on the birth anniversary of B R Ambedkar, accusing the party of turning Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and OBCs into "second-class citizens" while in

the airport, he alleged the Congress has become the destroyer of the Constitution framed by Ambedkar.

Congress "crushed" the Constitution whenever its government faced danger, Modi alleged and pointed to the 1975-77 Emergency to reinforce his claim. "The spirit of the Constitution is to have a uniform civil code, which I call a secular civil code. But the Congress never implemented it."

He referred to the implementation of the Uniform Civil Code by the BJP government in Uttarakhand to say, "See the misfortune of this country. Those who carry a copy of the Constitution, these Congress people, are opposing that.

The Constitution has a provision of reservation for the SCs, STs and OBCs, but the Congress never cared for them, the PM claimed.

"Babasaheb Ambedkar wanted to bring equality, but the Congress spread the virus of vote bank (politics) in the country. He wanted every poor person to live with dignity, with heads held high, to dream and fulfil them. But the Congress made the SCs, STs and OBCs second-class citizens," he said.
