

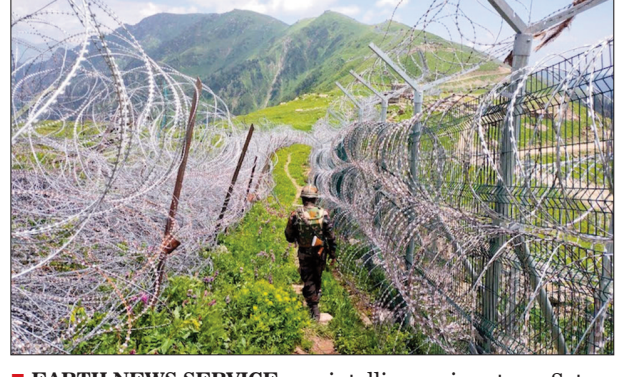

## Army thwarts exfiltration bid in Uri, 4 apprehended

Social Media leads youth cross LoC

**SRINAGAR:** The Army foiled an alleged exfiltration bid by apprehending three persons in Jammu and Kashmir's Uri sector, while in a separate incident, troops detained a man from PoK after he crossed the LoC, officials said on Sunday.

The Srinagar-based Chinara Corps said a joint operation by the Army and police was launched in the Uri area of Baramullah district based on

intelligence inputs on Saturday. "Two individuals from Sopore apprehended by vigilant Chinara Warriors while attempting exfiltration in Uri Sector with inimical intent along with their accomplice guide. Further probe underway," the Chinara Corps said in a post on X.

Officials identified the apprehended persons as Adil Hussain, Ishfaq Lone and Jafar Hafiz.

## 50 days drive leads to massive seizures

**JAMMU:** Touted as the biggest crackdown on drug trafficking and narco-terrorism, the first 50 days of the 'Nasha Mukta Jammu Kashmir Abhiyaan' have seen the arrest of over 1,000 peddlers, confiscation of 341 kg of narcotics, and attachment and demolition of properties worth more than Rs 200 crore, officials said.

Launched by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha on April 11, the initiative has targeted the entire narcotics ecosystem in

the Union territory, dismantling trafficking and narco-terror networks in its wake, they said.

Official figures show that from April 11 to May 29, Jammu and Kashmir Police registered 923 FIRs and arrested 1,018 persons over narcotics-related offences.

During the period, police seized 341 kg of narcotics, including 12 kg of heroin worth Rs 120 crore, besides 23,752 units of psychotropic tablets, they said. Authorities also detained 55 individuals under the Prevention ► P11
