The primary focus of the meeting was ensuring the safety and security of vital infrastructure in the district. Several measures were discussed, including the establishment of a CCTV control room, deployment of Video



Data Gateways, and the strategic placement of Special Operations Group personnel. Additionally, the inclusion of trained canine units was proposed to enhance surveillance efforts.

Security protocols will also include ensuring security personnel at entry points, implementing a rotation system for security guards, and displaying contact information for local police and officers at

project sites. The meeting also highlighted the importance of controlled access with single entry and exit points, fencing, and containment strategies to bolster security.

District Magistrate Harvinder Singh stressed the importance of coordinated efforts and instructed all stakeholders to implement these measures to safeguard the district's critical infrastructure. Kotwal reviews progress of HADP and KKGs; calls for stronger participation to empower local farmers

KISHTWAR: Kishtwar, Nov 21: Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) Kishtwar, Pawan Kotwal today chaired a meeting to assess the progress of the Holistic Agriculture Development **Programme** (HADP) and the implementation of Kissan Khidmat Ghars (KKGs) in the district. The meeting, aimed to conduct a comprehensive sector-wise review of the initiatives designed to enhance agricultural development.

Nodal Officer for HADP, Amjad Hussain Malik, presented an update on the programme, revealing that 6,441 applications were received

from farmers seeking benefits across various agricultural sectors. Of these, 5,160 applications were approved by the District Level Committee, with 4,355 applications in the agriculture sector, 49 in horticulture, 490 in animal husbandry, 164 in sheep husbandry, 78 in sericulture, 18 in fisheries, and 6 in marketing. The ADC also reviewed the implementation of Kissan Khidmat Ghars and urged all allied departments to ensure farmers are registered on the KKG app. In line with this, a training program for Krishi Udhyamis and field functionaries from the agriculture and allied sectors has been sched-

uled for tomorrow.

During the meeting, the ADC emphasized the importance of recruiting adequate Krishi Udhyamis for the second phase of the program. He directed an extension of the advertisement deadline to maximize participation and instructed field functionaries to prioritize the registration of eligible candidates across the

The meeting was attended by senior officials including the District Sheep Husbandry Officer, District Agriculture Officer, Saffron Development Officer, Sub-Divisional Agriculture Officers, Subject Matter Specialists, and other relevant staff from agriculture and allied sectors.

Bakaya anguished over demolition of KP Shops in Muthi

JAMMU: Vijay Bakaya, General Secretary of Apni Party and former Member of Legislative Council (MLC), has expressed deep dismay over the recent demolition of shops run by displaced Kashmiri Pandits in the Muthi area of Jammu.

In a statement issued today, Bakaya criticized the Jammu Development Authority (JDA) for what he called an "insensitive and ruthless" demolition drive targeting the migrant community. Citing media reports, Bakaya revealed that several shops operated by Kashmiri Pandit migrants for nearly 30 years were dismantled by the JDA without prior notice or provision of alternative arrangements.

Bakaya condemned the act, describing it as "high-handed" and questioned the JDA's intentions. "If there was any legitimate reason for removing these shops, the authorities should have issued a notice and provided an



alternative location," he stated. The former MLC further highlighted that the demolition has deprived the displaced shop-

keepers of their livelihoods, which they had sustained for decades despite their struggles as migrants.

Bakaya has urged the JDA to immediately rehabilitate the affected shopkeepers and ensure their means of livelihood are restored.
