At least 33 killed in Pak terror attack

ISLAMABAD: At least 33 people were killed and 30 others injured in a gun attack carried out on passenger vans in the Kurram district of Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province on Thursday, according to a Tehsil Headquarters Hospital official Dr Muhammad Ishaq.

The medical superintendent of the hospital Alizai said the injured were being referred to various hospitals in the district and some to Peshawar, Dawn reported.

A top provincial official said the toll could go up. Meanwhile, Ahmady Shama Station House Officer Kaleem Shah told Dawn.com that 38 people were killed, including three women, and 11 were injured in the attack that took place in the Lower Kurram area.

Pakistan President Asif Ali Zardari strongly condemned the incident and expressed his condolences to

the bereaved of the deceased. "Attacking innocent passengers is a cowardly and inhumane act," he was quoted as saying in a post on X by Pakistan people's Party media cell. He added that those responsible for the ▶P11

NEW YORK: Billionaire Gautam Adani has been charged by US prosecutors over his role in an alleged years-long scheme to pay USD 250 million bribe to Indian officials in exchange for favourable terms for solar power contracts.

US prosecutors charged Adani, 62, his nephew Sagar and other defendants for pay ing over USD 250 million in bribes between 2020 and 2024 to Indian government officials to win solar energy contracts on terms that could otentially bring in more than USD 2 billion in profit.

Modi to launch 'UN Int'l • Year of Cooperative 2025'

India to have 350 million children by 2050: UNICEF

NEW DELHI: India, projected to house 350 million children by 2050, must navigate critical challenges like extreme climate and environmental hazards to ensure their well-being and rights, according to a new UNICEF report.

It underlined that although India will see a decline of 106 million children compared to today, it will still account for 15 per cent of the global child population, sharing this responsibility with China, Nigeria, and Pakistan.

UNICEF's flagship State of the World's Children 2024 report, The Future of Children in a Changing World, was launched in New Delhi on Wednesday, spotlighting three global megatrends, demographic shifts, climate crises, and frontier technologies that are set to reshape the lives of children by 2050.

The report was unveiled by Cynthia McCaffrey, UNICEF India Representative, alongside Suruchi Bhadwal of The Energy Research Institute (TERI), UNICEF Youth Advocate Kartik Verma.
