BARAMULLA: In order to review the achievements under the Annual District Credit Plan (DCP) 2024-25, a meeting of District Level Review Committee (DLRC) for the quarter ending September 2024 was today held under the chairmanship of District Development Commissioner (DDC) Baramulla, Minga Sherpa at Dak Bungalow, here.

The meeting took note of the concerns regarding pending cases, and discussed strategies to enhance disbursements.

During the meeting, the DDC expressed concerns over the significant pendency of cases under PMEGP, Vishwakarma scheme, Mission Youth programs, and the Holistic Agriculture Development Program (HADP) in different banks. He directed banks to prioritize the clearance of ty Sector against the target



these cases, and emphasized the need to achieve 100% saturation under these schemes to strengthen the district's socio-economic development. The Lead District Manager, Mushtaq Ahmad Marazi, informed the house that the district had achieved disbursements amounting to Rs.2257.46 Crore under the Annual DCP 2024-25, representing 53% of the target of Rs.4272.53 Crore. Of this, Rs.1284.79 Crore was disbursed under the Priori-

of Rs.3567.27 Crore, and Rs.972.67 Crore was disbursed under the Non-Priority Sector against the target of Rs.705.26 Crore. A total of 75,782 beneficiaries have received assistance under various schemes as of September 30, 2024. To address bottlenecks in

pending cases, the DDC directed the Chief Planning Officer to convene a special meeting on a bank holiday, involving branch managers with the highest pendencies and concerned beneficiaries.

This initiative aims to identify and resolve bottlenecks in the processing of cases to ensure smoother and faster disbursements.

The DDC also urged financial institutions to conduct frequent outreach programs and awareness campaigns, ensuring beneficiaries are well-informed about the available government schemes. He reiterated the need for collaboration between stakeholders to achieve the district's development targets and improve financial inclusion.

Helmets non-negotiable, mandatory for riders, pillion: RTO Kashmir

SRINAGAR: Amidst the ongoing massive enforcement drive to check on underage driving and traffic violators across the valley, the Regional Transport Officer (RTO) of Kashmir has urged those using two wheelers including pillion riders to make helmets a 'non-negotiable' habit.

RTO Kashmir said while highlighting the critical importance of helmet use, pillion rider safety was often-overlooked. In an appeal, the RTO has highlighted the mandatory use of helmets under Section 129 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, warning that violations could result in penalties under Section 194D of the Act.

"Safety is paramount on our roads, and protecting lives begins with adopting responsible driving practices. One critical aspect of road safety is the proper use of helmets, not just for riders but also for pillion passengers," RTO Kashmir said. He said the pillion riders were equally at risk during accidents and were required by law to wear helmets conforming to Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) norms.

"Under Section 129 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, it is mandatory for every person driving or riding a two-wheeler to wear a helmet conforming to Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) norms. This rule applies to both the rider and the pillion passenger. Violating this provision can lead to penalties under Section 194D of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, which prescribes fines for non-compliance.

Cyber Police Kashmir cracks Rs 21 Lakh digital fraud case; 3 arrested, Rs 4 Lakh Recovered

SRINAGAR: The Cyber Police Kashmir today cracked the Rs 21 lakh digital fraud case, arresting three individuals and recovering Rs 4.13 lakh from the accused.

Addressing a press conference here, SSP Srinagar said the scam came to light after a senior citizen from Srinagar filed a complaint, reporting that he was defrauded by scammers impersonating officials from the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

The fraudsters accused the victim of being involved in a fabricated money launder-

issued fake arrest warrants and penalties, declaring the conversations a "national secret" and instructing the victim to lock his house and avoid any communication with others," the

SSP said. "Under this pressure, the victim prematurely closed his fixed deposits and transferred Rs 21 lakh to a fraudulent HDFC Bank account, falsely assured that the funds would be refunded within hours." An FIR was registered under number. 26/2024 and police launched a detailed investigation using ad-

vanced technical tools. "Teams were dispatched to Ut- lic advisory urging citizens to er demand payments, conduct tar Pradesh, Delhi, and Punjab, exercise caution while sharing investigations over phone calls,

ing case amounting to Rs 6.8 leading to the arrest of Gaurav Kumar from Shamli (UP), Gurpreet Singh from Patiala (Punab), and Ujjawal Chauhan, also from Patiala," the SSP said.

He said during the operation, the police seized 4 mobile phones, a MacBook, 13 SIM cards, 24 debit cards, 20 cheque books, 10 passbooks, and other incriminating materials. An amount of Rs 4.13 lakh has already been released back to the complainant's account. SSP Srinagar said that further

investigations are ongoing to uncover other conspirators and dismantle the larger network behind this scam. The police have issued a pub-

sensitive financial information and warned against falling prey to such schemes. "Legitimate government agencies will nev-

or request sensitive data online. Citizens are advised to verify the authenticity of such claims and report suspicious activities immediately to the nearest Cyber Police station or helpline," the SSP said.


AICTE Chairman reviews preparations for SIH 2024 Grand finale at NIT Srinagar
