NDA tsunami crushes foes, Governance wins: PM Modi; vows to oust 'jungle raj'

BJP's 95 pc strike rate propels NDA tsunami in Bihar

In a triumphant address at BJP headquarters, Prime Minister Narendra Modi celebrated the NDA's landslide Bihar mandate on Friday, pledging to eradicate 'jungle raj' from West

Drawing a vivid parallel, he declared that just as the Ganga flows from Bihar to Bengal, this electoral wave has paved the BJP's road to victory in the eastern state.

Targeting the Congress, Modi rechristened it the "Muslimleegi Maowadi Congress - MMC," predicting a major internal rupture soon.

He took a sharp dig at the party's elite, warning that certain 'naamdars' are dragging the entire ship down with them.

Adding a cultural touch. Modi donned a traditional 'gamchha' adorned with Mithila paintings, symbolizing his deep bond with


The PM termed the NDA's landslide win in the Bihar assembly elections as a victory of good governance, development and the spirit of public welfare and social justice.

LEH: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh on Friday ordered an extensive reshuffle of the judicial cadre, issuing transfers and new postings for 71 District Judges and Civil Judges (Senior Division) across the two Union Territories.

According to the notification issued on November 14 2025, the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh has ordered the transfer and posting of seventy-one District Judges and Civil Judges (Senior Division). The detailed order, issued by the Registrar General, restructures judicial positions across Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh, including repatriations from deputation, fresh deputations, new district postings and reassignment of additional duties.

Red Fort blast: Police intensifies social media, **CCTV** surveillance

NEW DELHI: Police have intensified digital surveillance and are keeping a vigil on various social media platforms to monitor conversations, reactions and potential leads linked to the Red Fort blast, police sources said on Friday.

Multiple specialised teams have been deployed round-the-clock to scan public posts, comments, videos and online discussions to detect any hint of radicalisation, misinformation, provocation or suspicious online activity emerging after the blast,

said a source. A senior police said that inputs gathered from social media monitoring units will be immediately relayed to field units and teams for verification and necessary action.

"Dedicated teams are assessing what people are posting or discussing online. Any suspicious activity or potential lead related to the blast will be flagged without delay,' the officer said.

Senior officers have directed all district police units to maintain heightened alertness and closely examine CCTV footage across the city.

NEW DELHI: Terming the Bihar poll results a "victory of every Bihari", Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday said the overwhelming mandate for the NDA is people's stamp of approval on its work for development, women's safety and the welfare of the poor.

In a series of posts on X in Hindi, Shah said the people of Bihar have conveyed the mood of the entire nation that the purification of voter lists is essential, and there is no place for politics against it.

The NDA camp has won at least 97 of the 243 Bihar Assembly seats. The BJP



won 55 seats and was leading in 35 other constituencies, while its ally JD(U) secured 33 seats and was ahead in 51 other constituencies, according to the Election Commission.

BJP retains Nagrota, NC faces defeat in Budgam; JK to have 4 women MLAs

JAMMU: National Conference suffered a historic defeat in its Budgam stronghold on Friday, ending a 47-year winning streak, while the Bharatiya Janata Party comfortably retained the Nagrota seat in Jammu.

In Nagrota, BJP candidate Devyani Rana won by a massive margin of 24,647 votes, polling 42,350 votes against her nearest rival Harsh Dev Singh of Jammu and Kashmir National Panthers Party who secured 17,703 votes. National Conference candidate Shamim Begum finished third with 10,872 votes.

In Nagrota, the BJP's

victory was comprehensive. Devyani Rana, daughter of late BJP leader Devinder Singh Rana, secured a commanding win in the bypoll triggered by her father's demise in October last year.

The voter turnout stood at an impressive 75.08%, slightly lower than the 77.66% recorded in the 2024 Assembly elections. The Congress opted not to field a candidate, while a BJP rebel, Anil Sharma, managed only 842 votes. Other contenders in-
