Modi to inaugurate Z-Morh Tunnel today: SFs intensify area domination

SRINAGAR: The security forces on Sunday intensified sanitization efforts and area domination exercise in Kashmir, a day ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the valley for in-auguration of the strategically important Z-Morh tunnel in Ganderbal district, officials

The deployment of security personnel has been increased in the vulnerable areas and dozens of checkpoints have been set up at important intersections in various districts to ensure that anti-national elements are not able to move around freely.

The officials said that random checking and frisking of people and vehicles, including two-wheelers, has been intensified while patrolling is also taking place.

"Security has been tightened near the Z-Morh tunnel. Multi-layered security arrangements have been put in place and the PM's security team, comprising the SPG personnel, has taken over the venue,"



The prime minister is likely to address a public rally after the inauguration of the tunnel at Ga-gangir, the officials said, adding the venue is now off-limits for the public.

Jammu and Kashmir Police, paramilitary forces and the Army are part of the security appa-ratus for Monday's inauguration. Extensive area domination exercises, searches and patrols are being conducted for the smooth conduct of the event, the officials said.

Sonamarg will be winter sports destination: Omar

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Sunday said the opening of the Z-Morh tunnel will enable the development of Sonamarg resort in Ganderbal district as a winter sports destination, similar to the famous Gulmarg skiing resort

"Tomorrow, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the Z-Morh tunnel. This will allow the development of Sonamarg as a winter sports destination," Abdullah told reporters in Gul-marg, 52 kilometers from here.

The Prime Minister is scheduled to inaugurate the 6.5-kilometer Z-Morh tunnel, which will make the Sonamarg town accessible throughout the year.

Abdullah is in Gulmarg to promote winter sports activities in the scenic north Kashmir town. "Over the next five years, we

will make full efforts to develop Sonamarg as a winter sports destination, just like we have developed Gulmarg," he added.

Abdullah said he had come to Gulmarg to record a program for tourism promotion.

"If more tourists come here, it will mean more earnings for the local people, whether they are ski guides, ski instructors, sledge operators, ATV and snowmobile op-erators, or small busi-nesses like restaurants and dhabas," he said.

The chief minister also said that the Khelo India Winter Games would be held in Gulmarg in February this year, and the union territory is preparing to host the event.

LEH: Ladakh, a region marked by its geographic remoteness and unique socio-economic char-acteristics, continues to experience significant strides in its banking sector.

Key players such as Jammu and Kashmir Bank (JK Bank), the State Bank of India (SBI), and a mix of public, private, and cooperative banks have played pivotal roles in driving both deposits and credit growth.

However, challenges such as a modest deposit base and high non-performing assets (NPAs) persist, reflecting the complexities of banking in this

As of June 30, 2024, Ladakh's banking ecosystem had seen a growth in its deposit base, reach-ing Rs 9,170.61 crore. While this figure indicates an increase from Rs 8,411.47 crore in June 2023, it also shows a slight decline from Rs 9,193.08 crore recorded in March 2024. Public sector banks accounted for Rs 2,518.98 crore, with private banks like JK Bank contributing Rs 6,287.26 crore. Despite this growth, the region's deposit base

On the credit side, Ladakh's banking system saw a notable Rs 500 crore credit uptake over the last year, bringing its

total credit portfolio to Rs 4,403.37 crore by June 2024, up from Rs 3,900.55 crore a year earlier. Advances to priority sectors like agriculture and micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) have been key drivers of this growth, though challenges persist in several areas. Despite the growth, the Credit Deposit (CD) Ratio improved to 48.02 per cent, up from 45.32 per cent in March 2024, but it still lags behind the national benchmark of 60 per cent.
