
Kara urges Block presidents to strengthen party at grassroots level

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee (JK PCC) Chief Tariq Hameed Karra called on party block presidents to bolster the grassroots units of the party to combat communal and divisive forces, ensuring the maintenance of brotherhood and harmony in society.

Addressing a meeting of block presidents from Doda, Kishtwar, Ramban, Rajouri, and Poonch at the PCC headquarters today, Karra emphasized that block presidents are crucial functionaries who serve as vital messengers of the party's high command. He urged them to strengthen the party's presence from the booth level to Halqa Panchayat levels, promoting the policies and



local level. Karra expressed deep concern about the growing communal tensions and the attacks on secular values and the Constitution, stressing the importance of unity in diversity. He reminded the attendees of the nation's programs of the party at the founding principle—uni-

ty across religion, region, caste, and color-which drove the British out of India. He denounced those advocating divisive slogans, warning that such actions weakened the nation's unity. The JK PCC Chief underscored that the Congress party must act as a unifying

force in the face of rising divisions, transcending barriers of caste, creed, color, religion, and region.

During the meeting, Karra took stock of the party's organizational structure at the grassroots level, advising the block presidents to strengthen the basic units in preparation for upcoming elections to the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs). The session lasted over five hours and also involved a detailed discussion on areas of improvement and necessary measures to enhance the party's reach and effec-

Manjit urges GOI to fulfill promise on JK statehood

VIJAYPUR: Apni Party Provincial President and former minister S. Manjit Singh expressed growing concerns over the delay in restoring statehood to Jammu and Kashmir, calling it a breach of promises made to the people. Speaking at a meeting with party leaders in Gurgani village, Block Parmandal, Samba District, Singh emphasized the discontent among the local population due to the unfulfilled commitment made by the government.

"Jammu and Kashmir is a historic state that was once ruled by Dogra Maharajas. The people of J&K have made significant sacrifices in building this state, and delaying the return of statehood will only deepen feelings of dissatisfaction," said Singh. He further stressed that the ongoing delay could undermine the faith of the people in the administration. regions, including the con-Singh also expressed disappointment over the lack of development in the Parmandal region, which he said had been neglected for decades. He accused the local administration of political bias and claimed that the people of the area had been deprived of basic facilities due to this. "The administration must

provide equal developmen-

tal opportunities across all struction of lanes, drains, health facilities, and reliable drinking water supplies," Singh urged. He also highlighted the poor response from government officials, with locals repeatedly reporting their issues, but seeing little to no action.

"People are often told to come back another time, but their issues remain unre-

solved," Singh added, reiterating his call for the immediate restoration of statehood in order to make government departments more account-

The meeting, attended by Samba District President Raman Thappa and other leaders, concluded with a renewed commitment to continue pressing for statehood restoration and improved

REASI: To review enforcement measures to combat the drug menace, District Magistrate Reasi Vishesh Mahajan chaired the District-Level Narco Coordination Center (NCORD) meeting.

The session witnessed active participation from key stakeholders, including the Police, Health, Education, Social Welfare, and Transport Departments. The meeting focused on fostering inter-departmental collaboration to strengthen the district's anti-drug initiatives.
