The talk underscored how 6G will play a central role in transforming global communication and innovation landscapes.

This high-impact session not only expanded students' awareness of future technologies but also aligned with the University of Ladakh's goal of nurturing digital leaders. By fostering exposure to industry-led insights on 6G and AI/ML, the university is paving the way for a future-ready Ladakh deeply integrated into the global tech ecosystem.

DC Nidhi Malik reviews readiness for outreach camps in 44 tribal villages

REASI: Deputy Commissioner (DC) Reasi Nidhi Malik chaired a comprehensive review meeting today to assess preparedness for a district-wide outreach campaign covering all 44 tribal villages under the union government's flagship— Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM-JANMAN) and Dharti Aaba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan (DA-JGUA) programmes. The initiative, part of the ongoing Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh celebrations, aims to deliver individual entitlements and raise awareness among the tribal people about key government welfare schemes.

As part of the Dharti Aaba Abhiyan campaign, Awareness and Benefit Saturation Camps will be organized from June 15 to June 30, 2025. These camps are designed to ensure saturation of welfare schemes at the grassroots level by facilitating doorstep delivery of essential services to tribal communities in the remote and underserved areas of District Reasi.

DC also reviewed the ground-truthing status of all 44 tribal villages, conducted block-wise by Gram Sabhas through Block Development Officers (BDOs), based on 25 key indicators — including the availability of pucca houses, piped chlorinated water, electricity, schools, Primary Health Centres (PHCs), and

Community Health Centres (CHCs), among others.

The ground-truthing exercise, conducted through Gram Sabhas, focused on identifying both fulfilled and pending gaps. The DC added that insights from this assessment will inform the preparation of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) and enhance service delivery during the campaign.

During the meeting, DC Reasi emphasized that village-level and cluster-level targeted service delivery camps will focus on services such as Aadhaar enrollment, ration card issuance, Ayushman Bharat (PM-JAY) health coverage, caste certificate issuance, PM-KISAN registration, and Jan Dhan account facilitation, among others. The objective is to ensure that every eligible tribal individual and family receives the benefits of these schemes without delay or exclusion.

To ensure effective implementation, the DC directed all BDOs and line departments to conduct thorough awareness campaigns in each tribal village. These efforts will support the targeted delivery of entitlements and strengthen monitoring mechanisms. She also instructed district officers to ensure active participation of their staff in upcoming block-level committee meetings and service delivery camps for better coordination and execution.

53 vehicles challaned, fine Rs 53K imposed

SAMBA: Taking strict action against the traffic violations, traffic Police rural on Monday special drive and laid Nakka at Patli Morh area of Bari Brahmana and challaned fifty therer vehicles and imposed Penalty of rupees fifty three thousand through e Challan from the violators.

Officials said that, under the direction of SSP Traffic Rural Girdhari Lal Sharma, DTI Bari Brahmana Sub Inspector Kartar Singh along with team laid surprise Naka over Jammu-Pathankot National Highway in different places of Bari Brahmana including Patli Morh, Sarore and Bari Brahmana.

During checking, the team checked 120 vehicles. As many as the team challaned fifty-three vehicles including black tinted films, overloading passenger, pressure horn, no parking and other offences.

The penalty fine of Rs 53,000 through e-challan. The team is also aware of



the traffic violators to follow the traffic norms and avoid rash driving and overloading of passengers in their vehicles. If anybody is found to overload their vehicles and not follow the traffic norms then the traffic Police will take strict action against them under law.

DTI Bari Brahmana Kartar Singh said that, under the direction of senior officials, Traffic Police launched special drive against traffic violators and challaned 53 vehicles

and imposed penalty of Rs 53,000 from the through e challan.

He also said that, during the drive traffic Police also challaned two Black tinted glasses vehicles, pressure horn, overloaded passenger, no parking and other offences.

The awareness camp was also held at Sidco Chowk in Bari Brahmana and spread awareness among drivers and conductors about the traffic rules. He also said that the drive shall continue in future.
