Welcome, His Holiness! Cold desert decorated with devotion as HH Dalai Lama arrives in Ladakh today

n July 11, two years ago, the air in Ladakh was filled with joy and celebrations as the Tibetan Spiritual leader, His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama had arrived in Leh. Exactly two years and a day later, the jubilation and celebration will only double as His Holiness will arrive in Ladakh on Saturday, the July 12, 2025.

The Dalai Lama, is likely to stay for around one-and-a-half-month in Ladakh and during this, he is expected to tour various places of the union territories, besides addressing the gatherings and giving teachings.

The Dalai Lama, who celebrated his 90th birthday last week, would arrive in Leh on Satuday morning, the Ladakh Buddhist Association (LBA) announced and appealed to the people to join in large numbers to welcome His Holiness.

The Dalai Lama will arrive via the

Technical Airport, near the Indian Air Force base where the national flag proudly stands tall, and will be received by the religious heads of Ladakh, along with the top officials of the administration.

From there, the spiritual leader will proceed towards the Civil Airport area, where the public reception is planned.

Ladakh Buddhist Association, Ladakh Gonpa Association, Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council Leh and Union Territory Administration, Heads of various religious organisations, other dignitaries and guests and stream of public is expected to queue along the way, to give a warm welcome and to seek blessings from His Holiness.

Thousands of school children in uniform are also expected to line both sides of the road as his motorcade passes, in their traditional dresses with scarves in their hands

From there, The Dalai Lama will proceed to Jivetsal-- His Holiness' Summer Residence in Leh, where he will take several days' rest to acclimatise to the weather.

Unlike his previous visits, the detailed itinerary of the spiritual leader's stay in Ladakh is yet to be made public, but his office has asserted that His Holiness will visit Zanskar for several days towards the end of this month.

Leh city has been adorned with welcome banners, and prayer flags, even as
