LEH: In a momentous occasion for the people of Cold Desert, senior politician Kavinder Gupta, hailed as 'people's leader', has been appointed as the new Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh.

Gupta, who has served the people of Ladakh as their deputy chief minister in the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir before its 2019 reorganisation into two separate Union Territories, will will replace incumbent Brigadier B D Mishra (Retired), as the third Lieutenant Governor of Union Territory of Ladakh.

Soon after his appointment by the President of India Droupadi Murmu, Gupta pledged to take all sections of Ladakhis along in his new role as the constitutional head of the Union Territory.

"The people of Ladakh will decide my governance agenda as I will ensure Ladakh soars higher in its developmental journey," Gupta told Shivang Satya Gupta, Editor-in-Chief, The Earth News, in an exclusive conversation in Jammu.

Expressing gratitude to President Droupadi Murmu, the Union government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah for entrusting him with the responsibility of steering the Union Territory toward progress, Gupta pledged to work collaboratively with the people of Ladakh and the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils (LAHDCs) to address the region's long-standing challenges.

'I am thankful to those who considered me worthy -- be it the Honourable Prime Minister, the Honourable President, the Home Minister, or the national leadership -- who have placed me in this position. I want to express my gratitude to all of them," Gupta said.

A seasoned politician who has seen the erstwhile State including Ladakh up and close, Gupta emphasised his familiarity with Ladakh's issues.

"The region was neglected by successive previous regimes and successive J&K governments before it became a separate Union Territory, under the Modi government in 2019," he told The Earth News, adding that he stands committed to address all challenges by working closely with the people and the LAHDCs.

A key focus of Gupta's vision is ensuring year-round connectivity for Ladakh, which remains cut off from the rest of India for six months.

"My goal is to establish 12-month connectivity, unlocking new opportunities for the people of cold desert," Gupta stated, highlighting the transformative potential of improved infrastruc-

Reflecting on his prior tenure in J&K, Gupta said, "I have served the people of this region before and understand their challenges. This is a significant responsibility, and I will fulfil it with utmost sincerity," he said.

Gupta said there are "certainly challenges involved, but I accept them. I will try my best to serve the Union Territory. This is a big responsibility, and I am confident of fulfilling it sincerely. We will work together with everyone (for the development of the region).'

Hailing from Jammu city's Janipur area, 66year-old Gupta is a senior BJP leader from Jammu and Kashmir.

In a long illustrious career in politics, Gupta served as general secretary of the BJP's > P11

Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh and extends him a warm welcome to the cold desert, as he sets out for a new journey to take Ladakh further on the path of progress and prosperity.

Congress 'Jittery' of positive outcomes, trying to sabotage MHA Talks **BJP accuses Congress for collapse in Apex Body** Unity; urges Religious Bodies to take over talks

LEH: The Bharatiya Janata Party's Ladakh unit has accused the Congress of unsettling the region's ongoing dialogue with the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), centered around the Four Point Agenda aimed at addressing Ladakh's socio-political and cultural concerns.

PT Kunzang, General Secretary of BJP Ladakh, claimed that internal discord within the Leh Apex Body was deliberately triggered by the Congress, leading to the resignation of its Chairman, Thupstan Chhewang. Speaking to The Earth News, Kunzang stated that Chhewang's sudden withdrawal, announced on July 6 via social media, came without a clear explanation. He suggested that Chhe-

wang's reference to avoiding "competitive interests" hinted at unease over political rivalry, especially with the Congress.

"About 8 to 10 days ago, a strange political development occurred in Ladakh. On July 6, we learned through social media that Leh Apex Body Chairman Thupstan Chhewang had resigned from his post. What made this development unusual was the absence of a clear reason – whether dissatisfaction with the talks, health issues, or personal matters", said Kunzang.

Kunzang continued, "He simply stated that he preferred not to be 'entangled in competitive interests,' indicating his disapproval of being dragged into a rivalry - particularly with the Congress party - over who gets credit as the foremost Ladakhi leader championing the Four Point Agenda.'

According to Kunzang, the Congress, despite being a constituent of the Apex Body, has been pursuing a political agenda. He claimed that during a July 5 meeting of the Apex Body, Congress leaders accused Chhewang of favoring the BJP and pushing its agenda.

"Shockingly, these allegations were made in Mr. Chhewang's absence. They were later conveyed to him by a third party, which appears to have been a calculated move to emotionally and psychologically hurt him. This malicious campaign, amounting to character assassination, was designed to sideline Mr. Chhewang from the Apex Body ahead of the upcoming LAHDC elections **P11**
