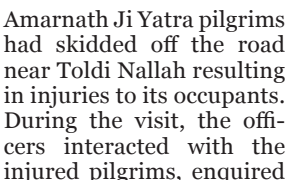

about their well-being and reviewed the medical treatment being provided by the hospital administration. The DC directed the hospital authorities to ensure the best possible treat-

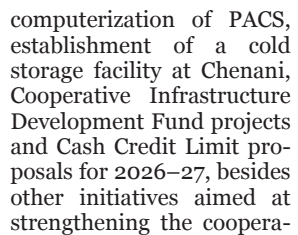

A detailed review was held on key issues, including the

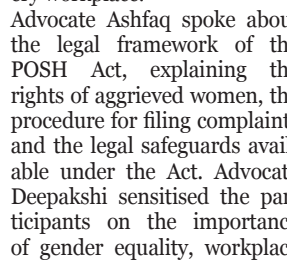

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To maintain environmental sanctity and cleanliness directions were issued for

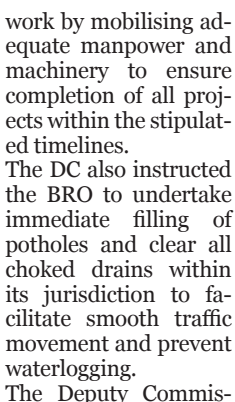
