take healthcare to the remotest corners of the district, the District Administration Ramban, on the directions of DC Mohammad Alyas Khan, on Friday organised a Mobile Medical Camp at Village Seripoora in Tehsil Gool under its initiative - "Hospital on Wheels".

The initiative aims at bridging critical healthcare gaps in hard-to-reach areas by providing on-the-spot medical consultations, essential diagnostics, free medicines and vital health awareness to the rural popula-

A dedicated team of doctors and paramedical staff attended to over 130 patients, including 115 General OPD cases and 15 Dental consultations. The camp also conducted essential tests such as blood sugar, anemia and malaria. Screenings for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and Tuberculosis (under NTEP) were undertaken, ensuring early detection and timely

Furthering the vision of digital health,  $25\,\mathrm{ABHA}$  IDs were generated under the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM). The medical team also sensitized villagers about flagship schemes like JK SEHAT, PM-JAY, E-Sanjeevani, NTEP and ABDM, while stressing the importance of preventive healthcare and healthy lifestyle practices.

## Sadhotra demands judicial probe into Mata Vaishno Devi landslide tragedy

JAMMU: National Conference Additional General Secretary and former minister, Ajay Kumar Sadhotra, on Friday strongly pitched for a judicial enquiry into the avoidable tragic deaths of over 30 pilgrims following a landslide on the revered Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine route, saying the catastrophe could have been

avoided with timely precautionary measures. Expressing deep shock and anguish over the loss of precious lives, Sadhotra said, "The tragedy is not merely an act of nature but a grim reminder of the administration's and Shri Mata Vashino Devi Shrine board's failure to act with foresight. The Yatra should have been suspended immediately in view of heavy rains and inclement weather warnings. Unfortunately, despite the glaring risks, the flow of pilgrims was not halted. This lapse has cost over 30 lives, leaving families devastated forever.'

Sadhotra also said that responsibility must be fixed and accountability enforced at every level.

"There is need for a thorough, transparent, and credible judicial probe that establishes the truth, identifies the guilty, and ensures such negligence is never

repeated again," he said. He also emphasized the need for a time bound fasttrack investigation so that guilty officials or agencies, whether due to negligence, mismanagement, or dereliction of duty, are brought to justice without delay.

Justice delayed will only deepen the wounds of the bereaved families. The guilty must be punished in a time-bound manner to restore people's faith in pilgrimage management," Mr. Sadhotra added.

# Unchecked mining intensified flood destruction: Vikramaditya

JAMMU: Unchecked and illegal mining in riverbeds has significantly aggravated the impact of recent floods in Jammu region, weakening natural safeguards and contributing to large-scale destruction of residential areas.

This was observed by former MLC and senior political leader Vikramaditya Singh in a handout issued on Friday.

The senior leader said the unprecedented natural calamity has caused massive damage not only to human lives but also to public infrastructure. He expressed concern over the closure of vital highways and inter-district link roads due to landslides, particularly pointing to the damage caused to the Lakhanpur barrage and the main bridge over the Ravi River. Such damage, he said, has paralyzed essential con-



nectivity and severely affected supply chains, making life miserable for common people while causing heavy losses to traders and transporters.

Vikramaditya emphasized that besides natural causes, man-made factors like rampant illegal mining in rivers have dangerously in-

creased the vulnerability of several areas. He urged strict enforcement of environmental safeguards to prevent such practices from compounding the effects of natural disasters in future.

He further called upon the Government to provide immediate relief to victims, restore essential services on a war footing, and take comprehensive measures to strengthen disaster preparedness so that such losses can be minimized in the times ahead.

Expressing profound grief over the tragic loss of 41 lives caused by record rains and landslides across the Union Territory, including the devastating incident on the Vaishno Devi pilgrimage route, Vikramaditya Singh extended his heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and prayed for peace to the departed souls. He also wished for the speedy recovery of the injured.

## BJP deputation visits flood-hit areas in Akhnoor, Chhamb

Villages remain waterlogged, standing crops have been destroyed, homes have suffered structural damages, and many families have

been displaced. The local

population narrated their hardships, citing shortage of essential supplies, lack of shelter, and urgent need for restoration of roads and electricity.

Speaking to the media after the visit, Sat said that the travesty faced by our brothers and sisters in these flood-hit villages is deeply painful.

He said that the people have lost their shelter, livelihood, and in some cases, all that they owned. He said that the BJP stands firmly with every affected family in this hour of crisis. He called for immediate relief distribution, medical assistance, and restoration of connectivity. The government must prioritize long-term measures such as strengthening embankments, improving drainage, and disaster preparedness to avoid recurrence of such tragedies, he Sharma said, "Our teams will remain in con-

stant touch with the people till every affected family receives due relief and rehabilitation." Sanjita Dogra stressed

the need for quick rehabilitation, stressing that the women and children are the worst affected in these calamities.
