He also directed the KVIB to handhold entrepreneurs at every stage from project formulation to execution so that ap-

proved units are established on ground without

Representatives banks were directed to ensure full cooperation in early sanction and disbursement of loan assistance to the beneficiaries.

DC directed the banks to adopt a proactive approach in financing rural entrepreneurs so that the employment generation potential of the schemes is fully realized.

Meanwhile, applicants whose projects have been approved are advised to approach their respective financing banks immediately for completion of the necessary formalities.
