# Friendship right choice, India-China pledge stronger ties based on mutual trust, sensitivity & cooperation

Express commitment to fair, reasonable resolution of boundary issue



TIANJIN/NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday emphasized strengthening ties with China, rooted in mutual trust, respect, and sensitivity, highlighting that cooperation between the two nations impacts the well-being of 2.8 billion people.

In discussions with Chinese President Xi Jinping, Modi underscored the importance of advancing bilateral

President Xi echoed this sentiment, stating that fostering friendship is the "right choice" for both countries and urged that the border dispute

Modi and Jinping agreed to work towards a "fair, reasonable and mutually acceptable" solution to the India-China border issue and pledged to expand trade and investment ties recognising the role of the two economies

In their wide-ranging talks, the two leaders largely focused on boosting trade and investment ties, a move that came against the backdrop of disruptions in global trade triggered by US President Donald Trump's sweeping tariffs including a whopping

50 per cent on Indian goods.

# Health, education, tourism-3 lifelines of Ladakh get major boost: LG Gupta

KARGIL: In a tragic road accident that unfolded during the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday, two persons lost their lives while three others sustained grievous injuries when a Xylo vehicle skidded off the road and plunged into a deep gorge at Shaitan Nalla Mode near Gumri in Drass. According to police

sources, the mishap occurred at around 3:30 AM when the Xylo, bearing registration number JK02BC-5894, was en route from Sonamarg towards Kargil. The vehicle went out of control and rolled nearly 400 feet down into the



"The accident appears to be a clear case of negligent driving on a treacherous stretch. A formal case has been registered and further inquiry is in progress to fix responsibility," said an Official from Local Police Station.

The impact proved fatal for two of the occupants who died on the spot, while three others, including the driver, were seriously **P11**

"During this monsoon season, natural disasters are testing the country. In the last few weeks, we have witnessed massive havoc caused by floods and landslides. Homes torn apart, fields submerged, and entire families destroyed.

The relentless surge of water swept away bridges; roads got washed away, and people's lives were in danger. These incidents have saddened every Indian," Modi said in the radio broadcast.
