### CSR powers Ladakh's growth: LG **Gupta**; lauds impactful initiatives

LEH: Lieutenant Governor Kavinder Gupta emphasized the transformative role of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in boosting Ladakh's development through education, healthcare, rural infrastructure, environmental ef-

forts, and skill-building. In a meeting with HDFC Bank and partners like CII Foundation, Citizens Foundation, Himmotthan Society, and PHIA Foundation, the LG praised CSR for strengthening public-private partnerships and fostering trust by driving visible social and economic

Gupta highlighted how these initiatives enhance access to essential services, empower women and youth, and promote local entrepreneurship and job creation for sustainable growth in Ladakh's challenging terrain.

"CSR investments not

only strengthen public-private partnerships but also enhance public trust by creating visible social and economic impact, particularly in challenging terrains like Ladakh," Gupta said.

Earlier, the organisations briefed the Lt Governor on their ongoing work in Ladakh, which includes waste collection and management, developing an apricot value chain in Sham region, promoting renewable energy, training women self-help groups in handloom and handicrafts, and supporting vulnerable communities through poverty alleviation, entrepreneurship, and capacity-building initia-

The Lt Governor assured all possible support from the Administration to ensure that CSR-linked programmes reach grassroots communities effectively and create longterm impact.

### India's highest dam construction counters China's mega-dam threat

ITANAGAR: India has launched construction of the 278-meter Dibang Multipurpose Project, set to be the world's highest concrete gravity dam, in Arunachal Pradesh's Lower Dibang Valley. It will be a bold strategic maneuverer.

This \$3.8 billion strategic move counters China's massive Yarlung Tsangpo dam, which could disrupt South Asia's water flows and spark a "Himalayan water

Led by NHPC Limited, the project will generate 2,880 MW of clean energy annually, bolster India's Northern Grid, and serve as a flood buffer.

Slated for completion by 2032, it will deliver 12% free power to Arunachal Pradesh and inject ₹700 crore yearly into the local economy.

Amid rising geopolitical tensions, Chief Minister Pema Khandu emphasized its role in national security, safeguarding downstream communities from potential Chinese water releases. Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for the project last year, but work has gained



in recent weeks.

"This isn't just a hydro dam; its real objective is to save the Siang River and protect our people from upstream threats," Khandu stated earlier this year, referencing fears of sudden water releases from Chinese infrastructure that could trigger devastating floods in downstream areas.

The Dibang River, a key tributary of the Brahmaputra, contributes about 7% to the mighty river's annual runoff at Pandu in Assam. Experts hail the project as a multifaceted boon: bolstering energy security, moderating floods, and fostering regional development through thousands of jobs and improved infrastructure. Yet, it arrives at a pre-

by Beijing's aggressive upstream ambitions. China's Yarlung Tsangpo megaproject - dubbed the Motuo Hydropower Station – broke ground in July 2025 in the seismically volatile Yarlung Tsangpo Grand Canyon, the world's deepest land canyon.

Costing an estimated 1.2 trillion yuan (\$167 billion), this cascade of five hydropower stations is projected to produce 300 billion kWh of electricity yearly, tripling the output of the Three Gorges Dam and positioning it as the planet's largest hydropower facility

The Yarlung Tsangpo flows southward from Tibet, entering Arunachal Pradesh as the Siang River before merging with the P11

### **Religious. Trade** groups in Ladakh slam Raja's land lease to outsider

LEH: A major controversy has erupted in Ladakh after several prominent religious and trade associations jointly objected to Raja Jigmet Wangchuk Namgyal of Stok Palace leasing land to an outside business entity.

In a strongly worded letter, addressed to Raja Jigmet Wangchuk Namgyal, representatives of the All Ladakh Hotel and Guest House Association and the Travel Tour Association alleged that land at Stok had been leased out to the Postcard chain of business entrepreneurs for setting up commercial activities linked to tourism.

The associations stated that the move violated a previously agreed decision taken in a joint meeting of the All Ladakh Hotel and Guest House Association and the All Ladakh Travel Tour Association, which had resolved not to sell or lease land to non-locals in order to safeguard the business interests of local entrepreneurs.
