

Indian economic performance came amidst global uncertainties and "aarthik swarth se paida hue chunautiya hai" (challenges stemming from economic self-interest), he said.

"Once again, India has outperformed every expectation, every estimate, and every forecast," Modi said.

While economies around the world are facing concerns and challenges driven by economic self-interest. India has achieved a growth rate of 7.8 per cent.



Modi emphasized that this growth is visible across all sectors -- manufacturing, services, agriculture, and construction -- with enthusiasm evident everywhere, and added that India's rapid growth is infusing new en-

The Kushok Bakula Rimpochee Airport in Leh was closed just days after it reopened post a three-day flight suspension last week due to mud accumulation from heavy rainfall on the runway and taxiways.

The disruption comes amid the busy travel season for Ladakh, when the region sees a surge in domestic and international tourist arrivals.

LEH: More than 170 glacial lakes in Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir union territories are showing worrying signs of expansion, raising fears of sudden flooding disasters in the fragile Himalayan region. The Central Water Commission (CWC), in its latest monthly monitoring report for June 2025, has flagged the two Union Territories among the worst-affected by the rapidly changing glacial landscape, reports appearing in the media suggest. According to the CWC, of the 432 glacial lakes within India that now require "vig-



orous monitoring for disaster purposes," 120 are located in . Ladakh and 57 in Jammu and Kashmir.


