## Centre, UT admn committed to inclusive, equitable dev, growth across Ladakh: LG

'Dark Sky Reserve in Changthang can boost Ladakh tourism'

LEH: The Government of India and the UT Administration are committed to inclusive growth across Ladakh, ensuring that every region, whether remote border villages or central towns receives equal attention in terms of ineducation, healthcare, and livelihood opportunities, Lt Governor Ladakh Kavinder Gupta said on Wednesday.

The focus of the UT Administration is not only on large-scale projects but also on grassroots-level initiatives that directly improve the quality of life of people in far-flung areas, he said while interacting with a delegation from Nyoma at the LG Secretariat in



The Lt Governor said that the UT Administration is determined to strengthen gover-

nance, generate employment for youth, and promote sustainable tourism, while also addressing the specific developmental needs of border vil-

He emphasised that the announcement of five additional districts for Ladakh, including Changthang, will strengthen administration and governance by bringing it closer to the people.

He added that the creation of these districts would also generate employment opportunities for more than 5,000 youth, ensuring their financial stability.

Highlighting tourism potential, the Lt Governor said that the Dark Sky Reserve at Hanle in Changthang could significantly boost Ladakh's tourism sector. He stressed the importance of training local youth from border villages like Hanle to become "Astro-Ambassadors" who can guide visitors through the Hanle Dark Sky Reserve. ▶P11

Alleges neglect of Ladakhis in UoL Recruitment

#### Kargili accuses UoL of Violating UGC Norms, urges LG to Implement 95% Domicile Quota

LEH: Alleging that the University of Ladakh was systematically denying Ladakhi scholars their rightful share in faculty recruitment, political activist Sajjad Hussain Kargili on Tuesday urged the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, Kavinder Gupta, to intervene and ensure strict enforcement of reservation provisions in the University and its constituent colleges, citing growing frustration among local scholars and youth over stalled appointments. In a detailed memo-

randum submitted on September 3, Kargili said that since the creation of the Union Territory in 2019, no regular faculty recruitment has been carried out, leaving qualified scholars disheartened and without avenues for advancement. He underlined that despite the availability of Ph.D., MPhil, NET-JRF and SET-qualified Ladakhi candidates with years of teaching and research experience, recent academic appointments have overwhelmingly favored candidates from outside the

Kargili alleged that the

University's refusal to implement the newly introduced Recruitment Rule 2025, which provides for up to 95 percent reservation for Ladakh domiciles under Gov-

M/1256/2024-S&TW SEC, amounts to a denial of rightful representation. He urged the administration to initiate corrective steps so that local aspirants do not continue to age out of opportunities.

The memorandum further criticized contractual appointments that, according to Kargili, disproportionately benefited non-local applicants despite the ▶P11


BJP rolls out relief in flood-hit Punjab, rebukes AAP

AMRITSAR: The BJP today launched a massive relief operation in the flood-hit areas of Punjab, providing essential material to the affected fami-

Undertaking an extensive tour, BJP national general secretary Tarun Chugh, who led the operations, said BJP volunteers would cover all blocks

Carrying the message of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chugh visited the floodravaged pockets of Ajnala and Tarn Taran, extending sup-



port to marooned people. He announced that Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan would tour Punjab tomorrow to assess the damage suffered by farmers.

He met affected families, listened to their pain, and distributed relief material including life-saving medicines, ORS, tarpaulins, mosquito nets, dry milk powder, and essential supplies for children. For urgent cases, he arranged ambulances and doctors to ensure no victim was left without medical care.

Earlier, Chugh dispatched relief trucks from Lahori Gate carrying fodder, tarpaulins, mosquito nets, chips for children, and bottles of clean drinking water.
