# Four-Day Refresher Program empowers ASHA **Worker for Stronger Grassroots Health Delivery**

**LEH:** A four-day refresher training programme for Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs) of Leh block concluded this week at the Chief Medical Officer's Office Hall, where participants underwent comprehensive sessions designed to enhance their capacity in delivering primary healthcare at the community level. The training, held in two batches to ensure wider participation, was facilitated by Mr. Yahya, State ASHA Trainer (SAT).

The programme revisited core responsibilities of ASHAs in public health delivery while addressing critical areas such as maternal care, safe childbirth practices, birth preparedness, and the management of highrisk pregnancies. Equally detailed attention was given to newborn and child health with sessions on breastfeeding, immunisation schedules, malnutrition, pneumonia, diarrhoeal disease, and growth monitoring. With a strong emphasis on preventive and promotive health, the sessions extended to sanitation, hygiene, early childhood development, mental health, palliative care, elderly health, and the management of substance use disorders. Alongside theory, participants engaged in practical training, home visit protocols, and record maintenance. Post-training assessments and feedback exercises were conducted

to evaluate outcomes and

strengthen learning. The refresher course sought to renew and upgrade the skills of ASHAs, empowering them to serve as effective health link workers and reinforcing grassroots health systems in the re-

In another initiative, the CMO Office, in collaboration with Ladakh Environment and Health Organization (LEHO), recently organised an awareness programme for School, Leh. The session focused on balanced nutrition, adolescent health, and the prevention of drug abuse.

Clinical Psychologist Ms. Phunchok Diskit, National Tobacco Control Programme (NTCP), underlined the psychological and social impact of substance misuse, while Mr. Tanveer Ahmad, Adolescent Friendly Health Clinic (AFHC) Counsellor at SNM Leh, engaged students on healthy lifestyle choices and the importance of informed decision-making.

The interactive event encouraged students to share perspectives and clarify concerns, providing them with practical guidance on nutrition, mental well-being, and avoiding high-risk behaviours. Health officials said the initiative reflects the department's ongoing commitment to preventive healthcare and adolescent welfare, equipping the younger generation with awareness and resilience for healthier living.

### CS assesses post-flood restoration across UT paigns on potential health During the meetings, the EARTH NEWS SERVICE

JAMMU: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo, on Thursday chaired two separate meetings with Administrative Secretaries, which were also attended by the concerned Divisional Commissioners and DCs of the districts, to review the situation in flood-affected areas and assess the progress of on-going restoration efforts.

CS took a detailed appraisal of the damage caused to public infrastructure, including roads, bridges, schools, and other essential facilities. He also reviewed the availability of basic civic amenities such as power, drinking water, and sanitation services in the affected regions.

CS further directed the Health Department to intensify awareness cam-

hazards in flood-hit areas and to organize special health camps to safeguard public well-being. He also emphasized the

importance of conducting safety audits of all flood-affected schools and ensuring proper hygiene measures before resuming regular academic activities, stressing that no compromises should be made in this re-
