Rising cases of fish poisoning deal a blow to Kashmir's growing trout industry

SRINAGAR: The flourishing trout farming industry in Kashmir has been dealt a serious blow with repeated cases of suspected poisoning being reported from different parts of the valley.

In the latest incident, a fish farm at Ganowpora village in Balpora, Shopian, suffered devastating losses when nearly 3,500 fish were found dead overnight. The farm, owned by Bilal Ahmad Lone, has suffered an estimated loss of nearly Rs 4 lakh.

Lone said that he discovered the dead fish early in the morning and immediately alerted the authorities. "I had worked tirelessly for years to raise these fish. In just one night, everything was destroyed," he said in despair.

Locals alleged that miscreants sneaked into the farm at night and deliberately poisoned the water. The police have since registered a case and launched an investigation to trace those behind the act. According to the Fisheries Department, such incidents are no longer isolated. In Shopian district alone, around a dozen cases of mass fish deaths have been recorded this year. They said nearly three dozen poisoning cases have been reported since January across south Kashmir.

Officials confirmed that at least 50,000 to 60,000 fish of varying sizes have been killed in these incidents in Shopian alone, most of them due to pesticides being deliberately poured into ponds. Despite advisories and monitoring by the department, farmers remain unconvinced. "We are living in fear. One night of sabotage can undo years of work. This is not just financial destruction, it is psychological torture," said another trout farmer from Shopian.

Trout farming has grown rapidly in Kashmir over the past decade. With government subsidies and schemes under the Holistic Agriculture Development Program (HADP), the valley has witnessed hundreds of new farms being established, particularly in rural districts. The industry not only supplements household incomes but also provides employment opportunities

Officials say trout farming is emerging as a backbone of rural entrepreneurship in Kashmir. The valley now contributes significantly to the state's aquaculture output, making the sector a vital component of the local economy. However, the increasing sabotage cases have cast a long shadow on this promising industry. Farmers believe that personal enmities and rivalries are driving much of the poisoning. At the same time, they accuse the administration of failing to enforce

"Unless there is strict punishment, these incidents will continue," said a farmer from Pulwama.

Traffic police refutes reports of challaning vehicles parked for flood safety

SRINAGAR: The City Traffic Police on Friday refuted reports that challans were issued to vehicles parked on higher grounds in Srinagar and other areas amid flood

SSP Traffic City Srinagar, Ajaz Ahmad Bhat, clarified that no such challan was issued to vehicles that were parked on flyovers and other elevated locations for safety

"Some social media posts and a few news outlets have wrongly circulated photos claiming that traffic police were challaning vehicles. This is false and misleading. No challan has been issued against any such vehicle. We request the public not to pay heed to such rumours," Bhat said.

He said traffic police personnel have been actively assisting people in flood-vulnerable areas including Natipora, Mehjoor Nagar, Shalina and others. "Our officers have been continuously responding to calls on our helplines and regulating the movement of traffic to ensure public

Kulgam police conducts market checking

KULGAM: As part of its sustained campaign to safeguard public health and ensure the availability of safe, hygienic, and quality food items, Kulgam Police, in coordination with the Food Safety Department and the concerned Magistrate, carried out extensive market inspections across the district.

The drive led to the detection of multiple violations of established food safety and hygiene standards. Consequently, fines were imposed on several erring establishments, including hotels, restaurants, and vegetable and fruit vendors. Furthermore, FIR No. 179/2025 at Police station Qazigund and FIR No 67/2025 at Police station Devsar under Sections 271 and 275 IPC stands registered against certain proprietors for grossly unhygienic practices, which posed a grave risk to public health.

SC upholds JKBOPEE decision on MBBS, BDS admissions for persons with temporary disabilities

SRINAGAR: The Supreme Court of India has upheld the judgment passed by the Jammu & Kashmir High Court in favour of the decision taken by the Jammu and Kashmir Board of Professional Entrance Examinations (JKBOPEE) regarding the eligibility of persons with temporary disabilities for MBBS and BDS admissions.

The Supreme Court dismissed the Special Leave Petition (Civil) challenging the High Court's ruling issued last year in W.P. (C) concerning the eligibility of individuals with temporary

disabilities for admission to MBBS or BDS courses for the academic session 2024-25 under the Persons with Benchmark Disability (PWD) category, which falls under the Horizontal Reservation.

JKBOPEE Secretary Dr Shabir Hussain Keen said, "Aggrieved by the rejection of temporary disability certificates by JKBOPEE, the petitioners approached the Division Bench of the Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court, which set a minimum period of 10 years for a disability to qualify as long-term and eligible for reservation benefits under the PWD cate-

He said that out of five petitioners, two filed SLPs (Special Leave Petitions) in the Supreme Court. The SLPs were heard extensively on multiple occasions. After considering sides, the Supreme Court observed that no relief could be granted to the petitioners. While the Court condoned the delay in filing, it ultimately dismissed the petitions, vacated the interim order, and disposed of all pending applications.

Dr Keen added that with this decision, the judgment of the Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court stands upheld.

Meanwhile, on-spot testing of water sources is also being conducted for public safety.

Regarding healthcare, DC said that medical teams with mobile ambulances and essential medicines have been deployed in all six flood-affected villages — Rakh Shalina, Shalina, Bagh Shakurshah, Seerbagh, Summerbugh & Zoonipora to provide timely medical care to the people.

Speaking on the restoration of services, the DC said that work on electricity restoration is being carried out on war footing bases. He added that the local receiving station had been damaged, but necessary repairs are underway and supply will be restored at the earliest. DC further assured that work on restoration of the breached bund at Zoonipora will be taken up shortly in consultation with experts to prevent further damage and safeguard adjoining habitations. He directed all line depart-

ments to remain on high alert, ensure coordination, and provide immediate relief wherever required. ADC Budgam, SDM chadoo-

ra and other senior district and sectoral officers accompanied him during the visit.
